

A Pirate's Tale Script

A silly play in one act by Janea Dahl

PROLOGUE

(Two pirates, STRING BEAN and Bartholomew the Huge, run onto stage from opposite directions. They crisscross upstage and disappear again offstage. Then they run back on downstage and meet center stage.)

STRING BEAN

What has eight arms and eight legs?

DIRTY ROBERT

Eight pirates!

(They run offstage, and two more pirates (CUTTHROAT TOM and ONE-EYED JACK) run on in the same fashion, crisscrossing, and meeting down center.)

CUTTHROAT TOM

How much does a pirate pay for piercings?

ONE-EYED JACK

I dunno.

CUTTHROAT TOM

A buck an ear. Get it? A buccaneer!

(They run offstage and two more pirates, BLOODY WILLIAM and IVAN THE WICKED, run downstage. One stands DR and one DL.)

SCENE ONE

BLOODY WILLIAM

Scene one!

IVAN THE WICKED

Captain Goodfellow looks for a ship!

(They run offstage as a crew of pirates, DIRTY ROBERT, Short Stack, Bartholomew the Huge, BLOODY WILLIAM, STRING BEAN, CUTTHROAT TOM, ONE-EYED JACK, and FLINT led by CAPTAIN GOODFELLOW enter stage right.)

GOODFELLOW

Oh?

FLINT

Look at it. We're supposed to scare people, not make them laugh.

GOODFELLOW

Right. Right.

(Flint marches up to Mutton.)

FLINT

Look here, Leg O' Lamb—

MUTTON
The name's Mutton.

FLINT
Whatever. This ship won't do.

GOODFELLOW (whispers)

You see, we're pirates. We're in search of a magical buried treasure. I have a map that's been passed down from my father to my father to my father--.

(Flint runs over and puts his hand over Goodfellow's mouth.)

FLINT

We just need a ship that's frightening,
(Flint rolls his eyes, as Mutton starts to head offstage.)

MUTTON

Ah! Why didn't you say so! I'll fix ya right up!

GOODFELLOW

He's going to fix it!

ONE-EYED JACK

Maybe he has another ship.

BARTHOLOMEW THE HUGE

I'm sure that's it.

NARRATOR

(The pirates nod in agreement as Mutton returns with a plank bearing the words, THE DREAD SHIP, which he sticks on the ship right above the word PEPPERMINT.)

MUTTON

That oughta do it.

GOODFELLOW

Ah! Much better.
(He empties a pouch of gold coins and hands them over as Flint throws his hands in the air.)

NARRATOR

Captain Goodfellow and his crew climbed aboard the Dread Ship Peppermint and started their search for the magical buried treasure.
(All pirates move the boat to center stage and "climb in" as two pirates, SHORT STACK and DIRTY ROBERT come downstage R and L.)

(Both pirates lie back down and pretend to be passed out. Flint is the first to awake. He wakes up CUTTHROAT TOM who is still verrry sleepy and pulls him downstage.)

SCENE TWO

DIRTY ROBERT
Scene two!

SHORTHACK

The pirates set sail in search of treasure!

(SHORT STACK and DIRTY ROBERT stay outside of the boat and make "waves" signifying that the ship is adrift on the sea. Actors can use "wave" props. Flint holds the wheel of the ship as Goodfellow studies a treasure map.)

GOODFELLOW

According to this map, when the moon is below us, we shall find Sugar Island. It looks like a clump of dirt that has a crooked palm tree growing straight down into the earth.

(Flint grabs the map while steering and turns it right-side up.)

Ah ha! No wonder my father never found the treasure!

(The pirates making "waves" become more frenzied.)

CUTTHROAT TOM

A storm's a brewin!
Thar's land ahoy!

IVAN THE WICKED

We'll not make it!

BARTHOLOMEW

(The whole boat begins to shake. Pirates hang on for dear life. The boat flattens, and the pirates collapse... washed ashore, they lie sprawled on the beach.)

SCENE THREE

ONE-EYED JACK

Scene Three!

(Another pirate pops his head up...)

STRING BEAN

Flint plans a mutiny!

NARRATOR Flint had an evil plan. As soon as the ship landed on the island, he was planning on turning all of the men against Captain Goodfellow. He had asked Cutthroat Tom, who was afraid of the sight of blood, to talk to all of the pirates and convince them to make Flint the new captain.

FLINT You remember what we talked about earlier?

CUTTHROAT TOM (rubbing his eyes) Yeah, I don't like my cereal without milk either, too bad we can't bring a cow aboard ship—

FLINT —Not that! (he whispers to Cutthroat)

CUTTHROAT TOM Oh! The MUTINY!

FLINT Shhhhhh!

CUTTHROAT TOM (whispering) The mutiny.

FLINT Have you spoken to all of the men?

CUTTHROAT TOM All but one.

FLINT Who's left?

CUTTHROAT TOM Captain Goodfellow. I can get to him today.

FLINT No! Don't tell the Captain!

CUTTHROAT TOM —Really, it's no problem. I just haven't had time with all of the deck swabbing and sail hoisting.

FLINT —Just, just never mind. *I'll take care of the Captain.*

CUTTHROAT TOM You sure it's no trouble?

(Flint shakes his head as the rest of the pirates start waking up. One pirate stands upstage with his arms up in the air, sort of eerie and crooked. This pirate (the one who played Mutton in the first scene) tries to keep up this pose throughout the next few scenes... occasionally losing his balance and falling over and grimacing a lot throughout the ordeal. One-Eyed Jack sees it first.)

SCENE FOUR

ONE-EYED JACK
Scene Four!

STRING BEAN The pirates find Sugar Island.

ONE-EYED JACK Captain! Captain! There... look at that tree!

GOODFELLOW (pulling out his map, checking it against the figure in the distance)

By jove, I think we've found Sugar Island!

(STRING BEAN leans down and tastes the sand.)

FLINT What do you think you're doin'?

STRING BEAN Checkin' to see if it's sugar.

FLINT Well?

STRING BEAN Nope.

SHORT STACK What's the map say next, Captain?

GOODFELLOW Next, we take five hundred paces—

IVAN THE WICKED Five hundred paces! We'll be over the island and back into the water.

BARTHOLOMEW Maybe it's five hundred paces around the island.

IVAN THE WICKED You mean in circles?

BARTHOLOMEW Precisely.

STRING BEAN Makes sense.

CUTTHROAT TOM

Where do we start?

(*Flint shakes his head and sits downstage...just watching.*)

GOODFELLOW

Since we landed over there, and the moon is up there... I think we should start... here. (*he picks an arbitrary spot.*)

(*The pirates smash together in a tightly squeezed line and start walking as a unit. Goodfellow counts. Some pirates can step on each other's toes, some bump into one another, some call out, "Ouch." They are a clumsy group as they walk in a big circle around the stage. Two pirates, DIRTY ROBERT and BLOODY WILLIAM, break away and call out from downstage left and downstage right.*)

SCENE FIVE

DIRTY ROBERT

Scene Five!

BLOODY WILLIAM

The pirates keep searching for buried treasure.

(*Robert and William rejoin the group as Captain Goodfellow continues to lead the living men in circles.*)

GOODFELLOW

Three hundred sixty-seven... three hundred sixty-eight... three hundred sixty-nine...

(*Two pirates, ONE-EYED JACK and IVAN THE WICKED, break away again and stand downstage.*)

SCENE SIX

ONE-EYED JACK

Scene Six!

IVAN THE WICKED

More of the same!

ONE-EYED JACK

What?

IVAN THE WICKED

That's what it said in the script.

(*They shrug and rejoin the group, still walking in circles.*)

GOODFELLOW

Four hundred ninety-seven... four hundred ninety-eight... four hundred ninety-nine... (*he hats*) five hundred!

(*Everyone pauses for a moment as they realize what has happened.*)

SHORT STACK

We're exactly where we started.

GOODFELLOW

(*as if he's solved a mystery)*

Interesting. Very interesting... who has the shovel?

(*One pirate after another looks to the person next to him, each shaking his head "no," until the last one looks at Flint, still sitting downstage.*)

FLINT

(*sarcastically*)

Interesting. Very interesting.

GOODFELLOW

Sticks will do as well... get to work, men!

(*The pirates all chip in and start to work on digging a hole in the sand. They really put their all into it... but alas, they are an uncoordinated bunch. Some get dirt in their eye. Some get dirt poured on them by the fellow next to them. Flint watches in amazement at the incompetence of the group. He bends down and picks up the treasure map.*)

(*He immediately "sees" something on the map.*)

FLINT

Uh, Captain?

GOODFELLOW

Busy digging.

FLINT

But Captain? You'll want to see this. He motions for Goodfellow to join him.

(*Goodfellow climbs out of the hole and joins Flint downstage. Flint holds the map.*)

Do you see this?

GOODFELLOW

Yes.

FLINT

What is it?

GOODFELLOW
That's a coffee stain.

FLINT
Not *that...* that!

GOODFELLOW
Oh, that's the treasure.

(*Flint waits for him to recognize what he's saying.*)

The treasure! It's right under the tree!

(*The pirate posing as the tree looks at the box he's standing on.*)

Ahoy! Men! Stop digging! The treasure's-

NARRATOR
Just then, Flint seized his chance to turn against Captain Goodfellow.

SCENE SEVEN

ONE-EYED JACK
Scene Seven!

IVAN THE WICKED
The mutiny!

FLINT
(*drawing his sword*)
Not so fast.

GOODFELLOW
What's this?

FLINT
Sorry, Captain. Men?
(*About half of the men draw their swords.*)

NARRATOR
Flint realized that only half of the men were siding with him and half were with Captain Goodfellow. He calls out for CUTTHROAT TOM.

FLINT
What's this? Tom, I thought you said you talked to all the men.

CUTTHROAT TOM
I did.

FLINT
Well...

CUTTHROAT TOM
Not all of them said "yes!"

NARRATOR
Suddenly, the pirates realize what's about to happen. There's going to be a fight!

STRING BEAN
Fight!

(*All of the pirates draw their swords and begin to fight. Some run from each other, some try and fight. Various things fly from the melee, a rubber chicken, a wig, a frisbee. The fight goes on for a minute or two.*)

GOODFELLOW
Stop!

(*The pirates don't stop.*)

GOODFELLOW
Stop, I say!

(*Actors must find a funny way to end the fight.*)

NARRATOR
Captain Goodfellow realized he'd had enough.

GOODFELLOW
Flint, you're more of a pirate than me. I hereby relinquish command of this crew to you.

PIRATES IN UNISON
No! You can't do it, Captain! No!

GOODFELLOW
Ahhh. It's for the best, men. I never really had it in me to hurt other people and steal their things. Flint, the treasure is all yours.

(*Flint drops his sword and greedily runs to the treasure box, throws it open, and gasps.*)

PIRATES IN UNISON
What? What is it? What's in the box?

FLINT
Candy.

PIRATES IN UNISON
Candy? What, no gold?

FLINT
Candy! That's all there is.

(*Flint growls in disgust and runs away in a huff!*)

PIRATES IN UNISON

Candy? Yeah!

(*They race toward the box gobbling up mouthfuls in sheer delight.*)

BARTHOLOMEW

Captain? Captain, look?

GOODFELLOW

What's that Bart?

BARTHOLOMEW

The candy.

IVAN THE WICKED

Hey. The more we take, the more it fills back up.

ONE-EYED JACK

The legend did say that the treasure was magic!

GOODFELLOW

I have an idea!

(*Two pirates, DIRTY ROBERT and SHORT STACK run downstage.*)

SCENE EIGHT

SHORT STACK

Scene Eight!

DIRTY ROBERT

The Pirates find a new career.

(*Two pirates enter carrying a big sign that reads, "The Candy Chest!" They each stand on a box holding up the sign like a storefront, or they hold long poles that support the sign. One pirate stands outside the "shop." While GOODFELLOW and CUTTHROAT TOM stand inside the shop with baskets full of candy.)*

NARRATOR

With a never-ending supply of candy, the pirates decided to open up their very own candy stand right there on the boardwalk where all of the tourists were. Their shop soon became the most popular store on the beach. A steady stream of happy customers came through every day, rain or shine.

STRING BEAN

Candy, get yer fresh, delicious candy!

PIRATES

(ad-lib lines about candy) Sweet candy! Come and get it! Yummy for your Tummy! Sugar, sugar, sugar!

(*Meanwhile upstairs, Flint drags the old Dread Ship Peppermint across the stage.*)

NARRATOR

But Flint decided that he wasn't ready for a career as a candy man. He stole a bucket of black paint and climbed aboard the Dread Ship Peppermint.

FLINT

We'll have you fixed up in no time. (*He grumbles as he drags it offstage.*)

NARRATOR

Not one pirate went with him. They were too busy at the candy stand.

GOODFELLOW

(*To CUTTHROAT TOM*) Candy store is good business, eh?

CUTTHROAT TOM

Aye, Captain. Life is sweet.

THE END

(*After the show is over, create a curtain call, and announce that children in the audience can come get a free piece of magic candy after the show.*)
